Where we are now



- Much given (£1.7M) and pledged (£0.2M) = £1.9M
- Before December 2021 we were focused on phase 1 of our previous scheme, until its cost rose sharply to £3.5 - 4M

Where we are now



- The Diocese encouraged us to investigate a different approach – with a single company designing and building
- A local firm with a strong record has developed a design comparable to phase 1 – anticipated cost £2.4 - 2.6M

Features of this design

- Larger than our present Centre, with a spacious foyer
- Four good-sized meeting rooms and a bigger modern kitchen
- Accessible to all, with ground floor at church level and a lift

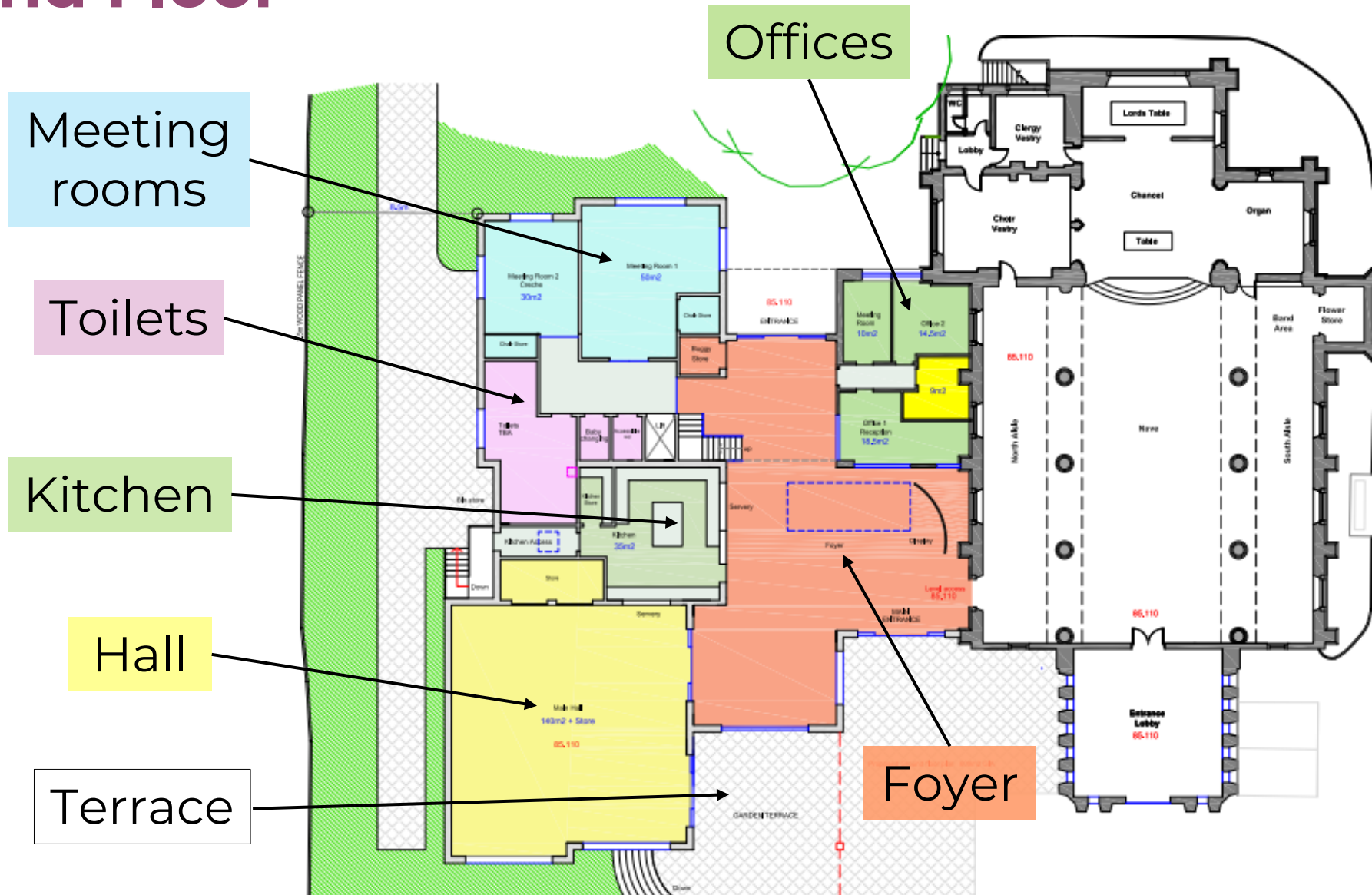


Features of this design

- Current office block replaced by office facilities within the Centre
- Hall opening onto terrace, overlooking the lawn
- Entrances from Carlton Road, London Road and the church
- **Connected!**



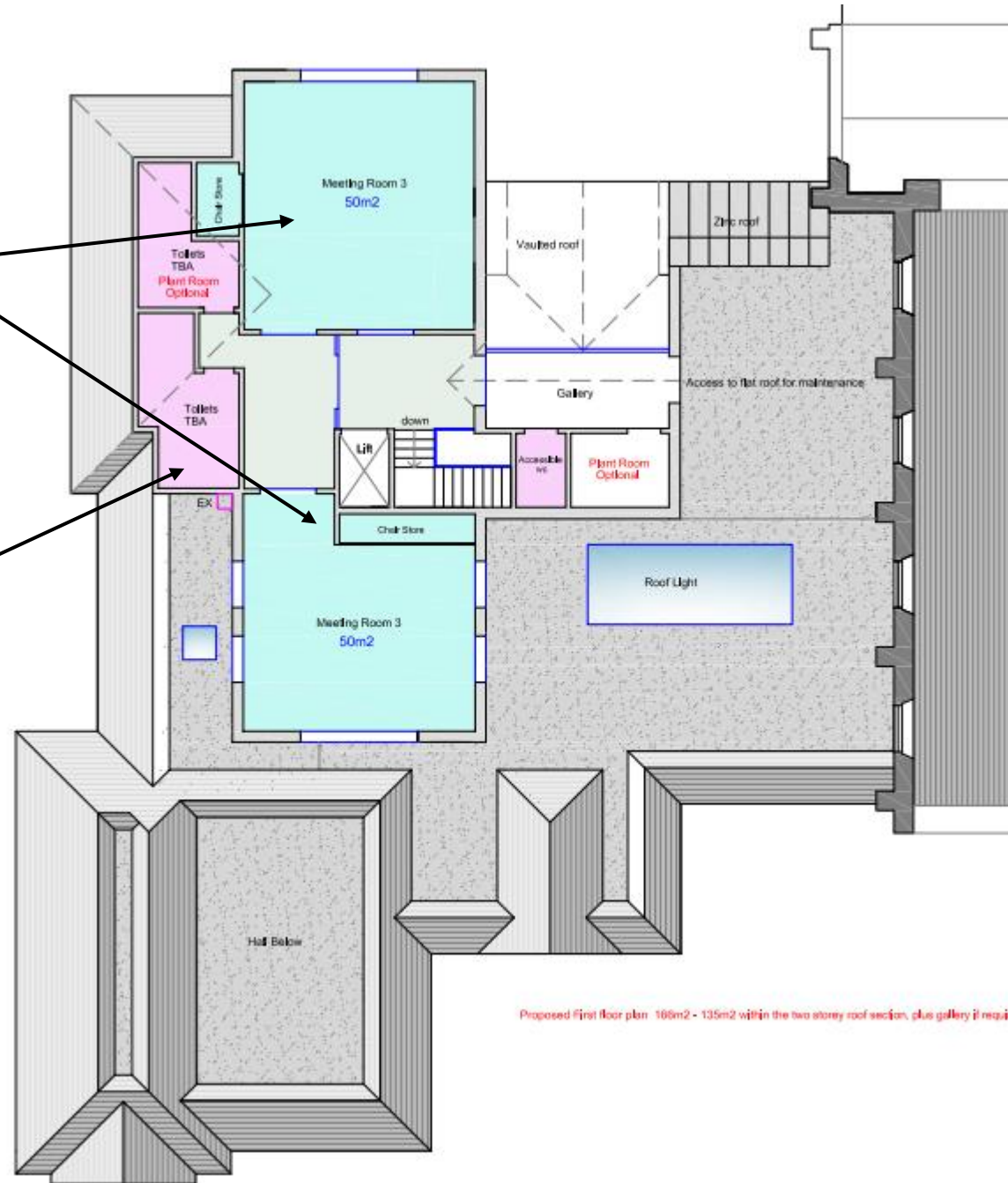
Ground Floor



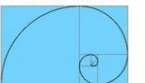
First Floor

East elevation

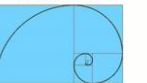

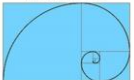
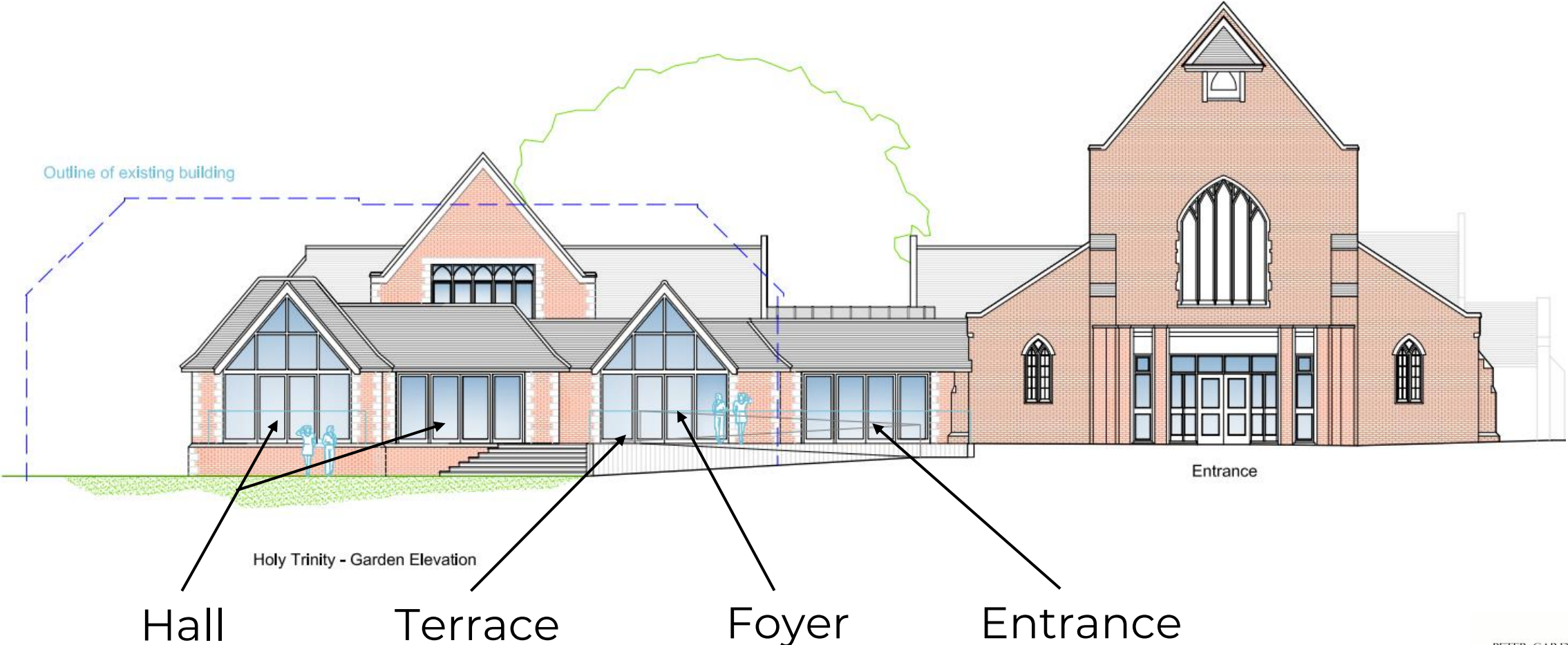
