Dear Friends,

They replied, 'Let us start rebuilding.' So they began this good work Nehemiah 2:18

The new design details for our Connected Building Project show an accessible and modern church centre, connected to the church building, and equipping us with premises fit for the next generation. They achieve our vision for connected buildings that will be welcoming, hospitable and which speak to our community of a church that is alive and here for them.

The response from those of you who have commented on the new designs has been largely positive and constructive – and there has been a sense of 'When can we get on with it?'!

There is a sense of urgency about this now – the builders have capacity to begin early in 2024 and the Connected Committee and PCC have begun to make plans for the time when the church centre will not be available.

Holy Trinity members, past and present, have given to this vision over a number of years and we have around £1.9M in pledges and cash. This gives us a strong position from which to make a final 'push' for the finishing line! Inside this booklet you will read more about the new proposal, plus details of the financial position and encouragement to pledge financially.

In Nehemiah, the people of God worked together in unity under God to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. They encountered trials, opposition and mockery, but under Nehemiah they laboured shoulder to shoulder to achieve something glorious for the Lord. Let us pray, act and give so that we too will soon be able to say 'Let us start rebuilding!'

The proposal

Encouraged by the diocese, we have investigated a new approach with a single company designing and building. A local firm with a strong record has developed a design which has met with positive responses from the church family. Its estimated cost is £2.4 - 2.6M, including a contingency allowance. Guided by expert advice, we believe the building will be VAT free and we are seeking certainty.

Design features, incorporating suggestions from the church family:

- Bigger than our present Centre, with a spacious foyer
- Large hall and four good-sized, flexible meeting rooms, with potential for later expansion
- A bigger, more modern kitchen
- Accessible to all, with ground floor at church level and a lift
- Current office block replaced by facilities within the Centre
- Hall overlooking the lawn, opening onto a secure lobby and a terrace
- Entrances from Carlton Road and London Road with a connection to the church

The financial position

Many people have given generously to the financial appeal to build a Connected Church Centre with 21st century facilities to serve the people of our parish in this generation and the next. This new design seems to the PCC to fulfil the purpose of the appeal originally launched in 2012, and we are taking legal advice to assure ourselves that this is the case.

The amount currently in the bank is £1.7M, mostly invested to earn interest. In addition, there are outstanding pledges amounting to £0.2M, some to be realised when a construction contract begins. This brings the funds in hand to £1.9M.

Based on an estimated cost of £2.6M, the total gap to bridge is £700,000.



Bridging the gap

When the project has the go-ahead and planning permission is granted, we will be able to apply for grants, which could help us forward significantly—hopefully £50,000 or more.

To bridge the majority of the gap of £700,000, however, we need to find out what our church family and wider friends can contribute.

We are not seeking money at this point, but pledges which will express commitment and clarify the financial position.
